## **Senator Ben Westland Speaks to Club**



State Senator **Ben Westland** addressed the club on the wins and loses of the last legislative session. Some of the items that were a benefit to our area were:

*A tort reform bill for volunteers, retired physicians and clinics. This reduces the liability of the many people who help out in the health field.*

*A Veterans Center was established in a firehouse in Bend for the many veterans in our area.*

*A mental health bill was passed*

that will actually lower medical costs.

*A jobs bill went through to benefit a firm in Albany to reduce an inspection process and keep the manufacturing plant in Oregon.*

*Civil forfeiture was clarified and the state can no longer confiscate property in criminal cases without a conviction and due process.*

**Senator Westland** described some of the serious partisanship that hampered the legislative process in the last session. He also commented on the difficulties with measure 37 that were written in to the original initiative.

The Senator expressed his support for "open primaries" as a way to reduce the rigid partisanship now existent in the Legislature.

**Jack Katz** presented the Cobra program (Battering, Rape and Assault Prevention) that will be in place in the county soon. He said the community often doesn't want to believe that abuse goes on. Cobra will bring in a former NFL player to make three presentations in the Sisters schools. The goal is to have men take responsibility or the violence that often goes on.

**Gary Fish**, from Deschutes Brewery, told the club about the history of Micro Breweries that have grown immensely over the last several years.

Gary also told of the history of beer making, which goes back many thousands of years. The Micro Brewery business has grown very rapidly in Portland With 28 breweries, Portland has the most of any city in the world.
