Speaker **Hadley McCann**, now a local photographer, was in the FBI for 29 years. One of his most interesting cases was with the Bagwhan at the Rajneesh Ranch in Antelope. It is a 65,000 acre ranch that the Rajneeshi cult bought in the early 80's. In an attempt to take over the City of Antelope, Homeless people were bussed in to vote for cult members to Wasco County administrative positions.

In September of 1984, they were accused of infecting restaurants with salmonella in The Dalles. Over 750 cases were confirmed. Another charge was attempted murder of the Attorney General of Oregon

In October 1985, indictments were issued when lab equipment infected with salmonella was confiscated. The Bagwhan posted \$500,000 bail and fled. The ranch was bought and donated it to Young Life, a Christian organization,
