SMART Reading Program Helps Kids

SMART is a reading program started about 14 years ago by former Governor Neil Goldschmidt. It stands for "Start Making Aa Readers Today". The program started with 4 pilot schools, one of which was Sisters Elementary.

A person agrees to spend 1/2 to 1 hour per week, one-on-one with an individual student, kindergarten thru third grade. The student is either read to and listens or he or she reads and is listened to. Many of the students in the program don't get this one-on-one attention at home so they look forward to meeting with their "SMART reader".

It's a very rewarding program both for the student and for the SMART reader. Anyone who has even 1/2 hour a week is encouraged to take on a student reader on either Tuesday or Thursday here in Sisters. They should contact the "SMART Coordinator" at Sisters Elementary or either of these two days
