

## **FRESH PRODUCE ADDED TO FOOD BANK**

Sister's Community Garden contributes fresh fruit and vegetables to the Kiwanis Food Bank. This addition will greatly add to the nutrition of the families receiving free food from the food bank on Thursday at the Kiwanis House located at Oak and Main Street in Sisters. The food bank is open between the hours of 10 AM to 2 PM on Thursdays.

Lance Trowbridge said that the Sisters Community Garden plans to deliver fresh fruit and vegetables to the food bank each week so it can be added to the groceries given to those local residents served by the food bank. A new refrigerator was recently donated to the program by the Oregon Neighborhood Impact program to store the perishable vegetables. Naomi Rowe who for many years has been active in the operation of the Food Bank said, "The fresh produce is a wonderful addition to the food we give out each week. We are also in constant need of donations of non perishable foods such as canned food and packaged food."

## **ICE campaign - "In Case of Emergency"**

We all carry our mobile phones with names & numbers stored in its memory but nobody, other than ourselves, knows which of these numbers belong to our closest family or friends.

If we were to be involved in an accident or were taken ill, the people attending us would have our mobile phone but wouldn't know who to call. Yes, there are hundreds of numbers stored but which one is the contact person in case of an emergency? Hence this "ICE" (In Case of Emergency) Campaign

The concept of "ICE" is catching on quickly. It is a method of contact during emergency situations. As cell phones are carried by the majority of the population, all you need to do is store the number of a contact person or persons who should be contacted during emergency under the name "ICE" ( In Case Of Emergency).

The idea was thought up by a paramedic who found that when he went to the scenes of accidents, there were always mobile phones with patients, but they didn't know which number to call. He therefore thought that it would be a good idea if there was a nationally recognized name for this purpose. In an emergency situation, Emergency Service personnel and hospital Staff would be able to quickly contact the right person by simply dialing the number you have stored as "ICE".

For more than one contact name simply enter ICE1, ICE2 and ICE3 etc.  
A great idea that will make a difference!

Let's spread the concept of ICE by storing an ICE number in our Mobile phones today!
