Wild Wings



Gary and Kellie Landers from Wild Wild Wings Raptor Rehabilitation (WWRR), Visited Sisters Kiwanis to tell us about what they do to rescue injured raptors. At Wild Wings Raptor Rehabilitation their all-volunteer organization's mission is to treat, rehabilitate and return injured and/or orphaned raptors to their natural habitat whenever possible.

The goal of any wildlife rehabilitation center is to bring the animal back to health to be released back to the wild. Only when the animal is as healthy as possible is that determination made. When release is not possible, every attempt is made to find the bird a home in an education facility. Wild Wings has sent birds to permanent homes as far away as New York and California, and as close to home as Sunriver Nature Center, the Oregon Zoo, and the High Desert Museum in Bend. Based in Sisters, Oregon, WWRR was established to serve the Central and Eastern Oregon regions after the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife indicated a need in this area for raptor care. WWRR cares for orphaned and injured raptor species that include eagles, hawks, owls, falcons, osprey, and vultures. For more information go to <http://wildwingsrehab.org>

The Sister's Kiwanis Food Bank is already planning its itinerary for the holidays. The volunteers are making a list and checking it twice to ensure that no one is forgotten. With the holidays season that seems to emphasize the commercial side of Christmas, it's good to know there are organizations like Sister's Kiwanis Food Bank, Sister's Rural Fire Protection District and the Nugget Newspaper. Like so many here in Sisters they are more concerned with giving. "People don't realize that Sisters has a tremendous need or a food bank and continuing support for the Christmas Food Share Program." said Dave Hiller, Chairman of the program. With the help from the many volunteers, Kiwanis distributes complete Christmas dinners to more than 150 families in the Sisters School District. Each year Kiwanis spends more than \$10,000 to bring Christmas Dinner to these families. Dave Hiller said, "It is one of the most rewarding efforts performed by the Kiwanis and its co-sponsors and volunteers." Right now as we move into the Holiday Season, Kiwanis' main focus is coordinating the Christmas Food Share and Gift program along with Sisters/Camp Sherman Rural Fire Protection District and the Nugget Newspaper. The coordination of these three organizations is what allows the Christmas Dinners, Gift and Pet Food to be available to lower income families, seniors and singles. The various churches within the Sisters community have always been very generous with their donations and volunteer help. This and the community at large are what allow Kiwanis, the Sisters Fire Department and the Nugget News to provide these meals and gifts.

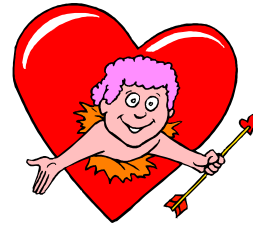
