She thanked the members and said, "We are the only club to pay our share. She also told us that she is still looking for someone to take her place next term.

Diane Kellser of Hospice

Diane Kellser of the Hospice organization that serves Sisters, Redmond and Bend told us that she is pleased to speak to us to give her thanks for our financial contribution (\$500) to help the Camp Sunshine at Suttle Lake. The camp was established to help children ages 7 - 14 years of age with the loss of a loved one. The eight week program uses a combination of art, music and movement to help the children cope with the grieving process. She said that in US 1 out of 4 children will lose a parent before they reach the age of 18. At Camp Sunshine 60% lost a parent and 40% parent committed suicide. It has been their experience that the children are greatly helped in coping with their loss due to the Camp Sunshine experience.

Medical Teams International

Our speaker was Dr. Randal Jacobs of Bend St. Charles medical Hospital. He told us that a member of Medical Teams International he and other medical volunteers numbering over 2,200 annually travel to Africa, Asia, Eurasia and Latin America to provide medical treatment to those who are sick and to train health care professionals in the countries visited with training so they can carry on the health care after they leave.

The medical services and training are dental, midwifery, Ophthalmology, special medical services and trauma counseling. They provide emergency medical services, HIV and AIDS, community health, disaster response relief, rehabilitation and preparedness.

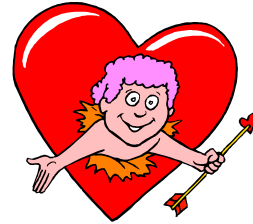
