## Food Bank Serves Record Numbers

### From The Nugget...

A heartfelt volunteer effort made hard times a little better for 202 Sisters area families this Christmas.

The Sisters Kiwanis Holiday Food Share program provided a Christmas dinner with all the trimmings to a record number of families this Christmas, while the Sisters-Camp Sherman Rural Fire Protection District provided toys, clothes and other gifts to children through the Giving Tree at

Ray's Food Place.

The Nugget's Furry Friends Pet Food Drive fed 386 pets (181 cats/kittens; 199 dogs/puppies; four birds, one senior horse and one ferret.) Twenty-eight families requested information for a free spay & neuter certificates for their 70-plus pets.

The food and gifts were distributed on December 23 with the help of dozens of volunteers from local scouting organiza-

tions, 4H clubs, Kiwanis Key Club, local churches and personnel from the City of Sisters. Kiwanis President Barbara Johnson, who coordinated the program, said the volunteer effort was unbelievably spirited.

"I'm just overwhelmed," said . "It was amazing."

The families who benefited from the community's generosity were overwhelmed, too, Johnson said.

That snowy morning, the Club was treated to a tour of the High School and served a super breakfast. Club members were updated on Key Club activities and thoroughly enjoyed meeting the whole club. One attendee noted he was surprised that the number of boys and girls in the club was roughly equal, not at all what he expected.



## Leadership Class Receives Check to Build Outlaw Outpost

Lisa Clausen made a presentation to the club on The Ford Family Foundation’s leadership series here in Sisters and then laid out a community project the Foundation is helping sponsor here in Sisters.

As a result, the club donated \$1,001 (\$500 from Kiwanis, \$500 from Ray’s, and \$1 to top Rotary’s contribution) toward the more than \$6,000 in cash donations

needed to get the project off the ground.

Outlaw Outpost is to be built near the Sisters High School’s Reed Stadium for use by the schools and civic groups. It is a covered pavilion that will be protected from the elements on three sides

and be about 24 feet square inside.

Lisa is hoping the swell of recent support for the project will provide enough funds to build the Outpost in late Spring/Early Summer. Timing depends on the ability to get necessary permits and donated materials, she said.



## Students Learn About CPR

### From the Nugget...

In an effort to increase awareness and educate the Sisters Community about Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), the Sisters Fire Department, Kiwanis Club and Sisters Middle School entered into a partnership.

Teachers Marti Dale and Annie Winter just completed a CPR Unit with their seventh grade health classes at Sisters Middle School. With the assistance of the school

nurse, students were given instruction and practiced CPR.

At the end of this unit each student was given a CPR kit provided by the Sisters-Camp Sherman Rural Fire Protection District through a grant from the Kiwanis Club of Sisters.

This kit will provide each student the opportunity to share with their families what they have learned about CPR, with the intention of educating families in CPR.

Each kit included a mini CPR learning mannequin, a CPR Skills Practice DVD and directions for use of the kit. Students were given the assignment to take time with their families to go through the kit and practice CPR.

Students were required to get their parents' signature on a form verifying their participation. The overall goal of this effort is to increase the number of Sisters area residents capable of providing life-saving support to a person in need.
