S.O.S. 2008-09 Collects Nearly 250 Pair of Eyeglasses



S. O. S. 2008-2009

Save Old Spectacles needed a new chairperson and Earl Schroeder stepped up. Collecting overflowing boxes from the Sisters medical clinics and bags of donated spectacles for club members, Earl mailed off almost 250 pair of glasses.

The eyeglasses are mailed to an optometrist, Dr James "Jim" H. Weyrich and his wife Ellen. Jim is a practicing optometric physician for 41 years and she is his optometric

assistant. Their practice is at Wal*Mart Center, Aberdeen, Washington. Eyecare Wecare Vision is a 501 (c) (3) not for profit; Foundation, Inc.; based in the United States; registered Christian centered; international organization; that does medical vision missions and provides eye examinations, eye and general medica-



tions, eyeglasses and provides for eye surgeries all at no cost to the prescreened indigents. The foundation has a branch office in the Philippines that is registered with the Philippine government under SEC (Security Exchange Commission) It is currently conducting

all of the free vision clinics there. The foundations target population is the rural poor who do not have access to, nor financial resources for, vision services. The foundation has no paid administrators or staff, everyone volunteers. The founda-

tion just finished its Medical Vision Mission from January 2 through January 10, 2009. This particular medical vision mission exceeded all expectations on the Province of Iloilo on Panay Island. The mobile clinic placed on a ferry boat from Negros Island. The foundation, along with twenty three volunteers, traveled to 6 different municipalities (Calinog, Lambunao, Cabatuan, Janiuay, Pavia, and Jaro - Iloilo City.) A record 2,014 Indigents received free examinations, eyeglasses, medications and referrals for eye surgery. We truly were "Delivering Gods Ultimate Vision Plan to the Poor."

Our club was represented at the Chamber of Commerce Volunteer Fair held on April 28th. Michele Hammer and Vern Renner were manned a desk handing out infor-



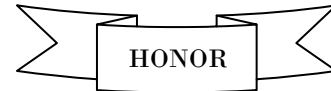

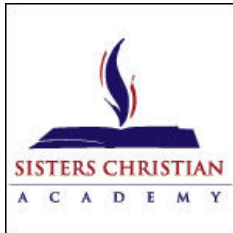
