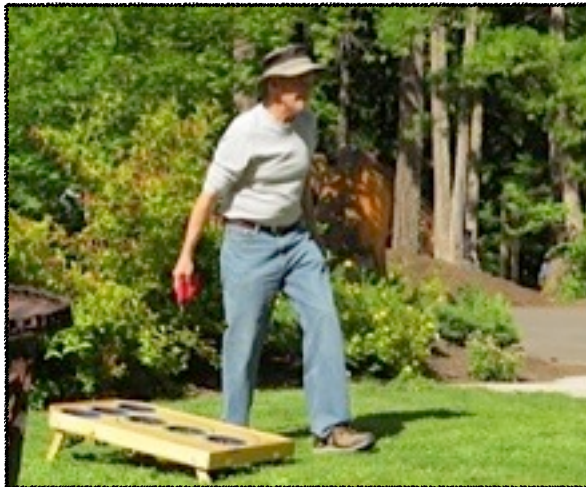

Kiwanis International 98th Annual Convention

Kiwanis International 98th Annual Convention House of Delegates June 28, 2013

Kiwanis International membership decline of 20% - focusing on ways to attract more new member & retain existing \$16.4 million in KI revenue, spent \$17 million.

2500 delegates representing 1700 clubs world wide

Proposed Amendments & Resolutions:

#1. To provide earlier publication of proposed amendments and resolutions, allowing clubs to take advantage of early-bird registration rates for the Kiwanis International convention.

Submitted by: The Kiwanis International Board of Trustees

Effective date: October 1, 2013

Outcome: 83% in favor

#2. To provide that district house action will be the standard method of endorsing candidates for Kiwanis International Board offices, with exceptions granted only in extenuating circumstances.

Submitted by: The Kiwanis International Board of Trustees

Effective date: October 1, 2013

Outcome: 72% in favor

#3. To provide that a district governor must have finished his/her term of governor before officially announcing his/her candidacy for Kiwanis International trustee.

Submitted by: The Kiwanis International Board of Trustees

Effective date: October 1, 2013

Outcome: Amendment was made to the amendment - failed by 75%. Original amendment - 87% in favor

#4. To discontinue the dues rebate (25%) for clubs that have grown at least 25% in the prior year. Recommendation based on only 0.1% growth since effective in 1998 & > loss of revenue (42 members, loss of \$44 million)

Submitted by: The Kiwanis International Board of Trustees

Effective date: October 1, 2013

Outcome: 73% in favor to discontinue

#5. Amendment was removed by the Board prior to Meeting

#6. To allow clubs to have varying number of club delegates at district conventions, based on number of members enrolled in their clubs.

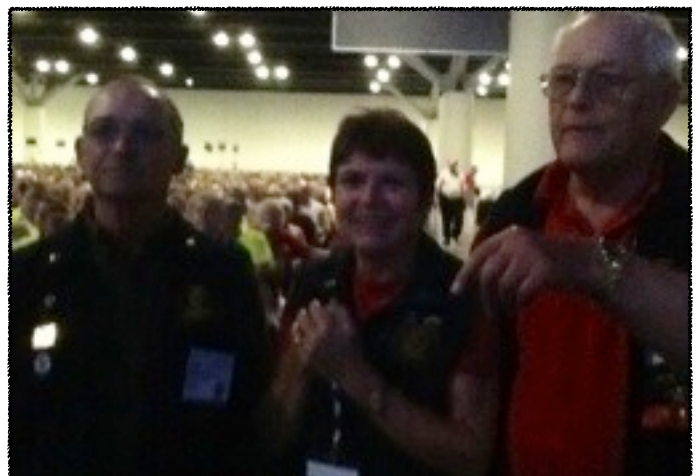

#7. To establish stronger disciplinary provisions to help protect the entire Kiwanis organization and youth served by Kiwanis from members whose conduct involves moral turpitude or whose behavior with minors is found illegal.

#8. To clarify provisions regarding conduct unbecoming a Kiwanis International officer.

Submitted by: The Kiwanis International Board of Trustees

Effective date: October 1, 2013

Outcome: 96% in favor

#9. To clarify that Kiwanis clubs are the constituent members of federations.

Submitted by: The Kiwanis International Board of Trustees

Effective date: October 1, 2013

Outcome: 87% in favor

#10. To allow flexibility in the composition of the governing board of a Kiwanis federation.

Submitted by: The Kiwanis International Board of Trustees

Effective date: October 1, 2013

Outcome: 96% in favor

#11. Amendment was withdrawn by The Kiwanis International Board of Trustees prior to the meeting

#12. To prohibit all campaign spending and restrict campaign practices by candidates for Kiwanis International Board offices.

Submitted by: The Kiwanis Club of Washington, D.C., USA

Effective date: October 1, 2013

Outcome: Amendment to the Amendment by those who submitted the original to clarify the language. 72% opposed 51% voted in favor of adopting the booklet verbiage, amendment was defeated because it required a 2/3 vote to adopt.

#13. To provide that a criminal history background check will be accepted by Kiwanis International when a district conducts its own background check on a volunteer that meets or exceeds Kiwanis International standards.

Effective date: October 1, 2013

Outcome: 100% in favor

#14. To restrict expense reimbursements for Kiwanis International past presidents to only the last three office holders.

Effective date: October 1, 2013

Outcome: 50%:50%, failed due to 2/3 vote required to pass

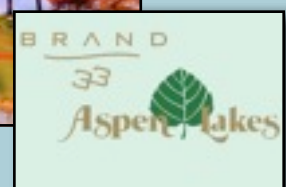
