Food Bank Building Project Makes Headway, Local Donations Still Needed


We are making great progress toward our ultimate financial goal for the funding of our new building but now is not the time to become complacent. Please keep up the good work, talk up the project with your friends and acquaintances and help us make the May 1st start date a reality.

Our Grant Writing Committee has submitted several requests and we are hopeful that one or more will come to fruition. But, it is a very competitive arena and there are hundreds if not thousands of hopeful entities hoping to snag some foundation money. As you have already heard, the **Roundhouse Foundation** did respond very positively and we matched their challenge of \$10,000!

Likewise, a request to our local electricity provider, **Central Electric Cooperation (CEC)**, netted a promise of \$5,000 and in another recent development \$1,000 was generously granted from the **City of Sisters** and their community fund.

In a separate article by our very own General Contractor, Gary Kutz, you will read that he is well along with the submission of building plans and permit applications.

It appears everything is moving along well but it is too early to take our foot off the pedal and we must continue to encourage local donations. The next six weeks are critical as by mid-April we should be issuing contracts for phase one of the project. It is also tax season and for some (lucky folks?) finding money for Uncle Sam may be front and center, or maybe they will receive a refund check!



Tom Worcester, Food Bank Building Fundraising Committee Chairman, reported great news that as of this week, the Sisters Kiwanis Club has raised \$86,505 for the project counting pledges of \$10,000 from Roundhouse Foundation, \$5,000 from the **Central Electric Co-op**, and also, \$1,000 from the **City of Sisters**.

The plans and other documents have been submitted to the City of Sisters for Planning Commission review. That process is to take from 30 to 45 days to complete.

This week I submitted the plans and permit applications to the Deschutes County Department in Bend. A notice will go up on the Food Bank Building about our plans to build and notices will go out to local neighbors.

Fred Ast, with **Fred A. Ast Jr. Survey of Sisters**, donated his survey services and, surveyed our property and has been making blueprint plan copies for us. Copies will start going out to Hoyt's and several other companies in town.

Matt Wittmer has agreed to be our General Contractor of record on order to get our building permit. He helped me build our personal house and did a great job. Many **Big Thanks** to him for that.

I am starting to send out request for proposals for the various sub-contracts such as: Excavation, Concrete, Plumbing, Mechanical and Plumbing. If any one still has favorite sub-contractors, please send me, **Gary Kutz**, their information.

In addition: **Dave Hiller** is looking for temporary relocation for the Food Bank during construction. If you would like to help, please contact **Dave Hiller**.

2nd Annual Sisters Science Fair Huge Success!

Sisters Kiwanis Club helped to launch the **2nd Annual Sisters Science Fair** on February 23rd. The Kiwanis Club sponsored the Science Fair in conjunction with **St. Charles Medical Systems** and furnished many volunteers that set up the exhibits and manned them during the Science Fair.

Before the Science Fair even began, about 70 volunteers were organized by **Barbara Bott** and **Wendie Vermillion**. Early on Fair Day, **Tom Worcester, Mike Vermillion, Gary Kutz** and **Yoshi Furuya**, worked with the set up supervisors, **Chris and Suzanne Carvlin**, to help get the school ready for the influx of exhibitors and visitors.

During the Fair, **Shirley Lalli** monitored the 75 elementary School displays, while **John Troike** spent the afternoon coordinating the visitors who wanted a time in the Star Lab Planetarium. **Jeff Omodt** spent the afternoon taking pictures of the approximately 600 participants enjoying the Fair.

Bill and Cindy Rainey found themselves measuring reaction times of the visitors for the second year in a row. This year, **May Fan** joined them. It was one of the most popular booths at the Science Fair. **Cindy and May** operated the measuring device, while **Bill** recorded and plotted the data. Once again they were able to show that auditory response was quicker than visual response. And, once again, the experiment did not show an appreciable difference in response time between men and women, nor did it demonstrate deterioration in response time with age.





Reporting from Puerto Penasco Mexico (Rocky Point) February 2013.

We arrived here on Feb. 13th to warm weather and calm seas. Many friends from last year are here, both 2 legged and 4 legged. Gilley is one of about a dozen Mini Schnauzers in the RV and we are trying to meet all of them.

Arrived just in time for Tequila Shot Bingo day. Yes, just what you think. When a game ends, if you have the next number called on your card, you can have a shot of tequila. Jack and I did not win any of the games but we sure had a good time, at least we think so.

Monday, the 18th, we headed out for our first 4 x 4 beach run. This is something we have done in the past and really enjoy. Up in the morning and back to the same place for breakfast. She is better prepared today and we all get something to eat before heading out. I am sure they were happy to see us leave the town.

On the road to the town of Cabora, our destination for lunch. Several of the cars decide to head home, they were the smart ones. After a heated discussion between Fearless Leader and his wife, we opted to use the real road rather than the bone jarring "short cut," which is 70 miles of rock road. Just because they are 4 x 4's does not mean you HAVE to take the bad roads.

Got to the town and asked about a place to eat. The recommended place was just down the main street. Off we go, playing follow the leader, only the leader did not see or heed the "one way do not enter" sign. Three of us (Jack included) drove 4 blocks the wrong way. The other 4 cars saw the sign and turned. Now we have two groups, neither of which really know where they are going, driving around in a strange city. 

Over the years, the Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show has donated over **\$4,500** to Sisters Kiwanis to support our community service for our residents in need, including our local Food Bank.

This year's Sisters Quilt Show Raffle Quilt is titled "Streams of Color." It boasts an abstract representation of fish swimming upstream.

According to the Executive Director for the Quilt show, **Ann Richardson**, "Streams of Color" was designed by Stichin' Post Owner and Quilt Show Founder, **Jean Wells**, and the quilt was pieced together by the **East of the Cascade Quilters** and quilted by **Laura Simmons**. The signature 'fish block' was designed by Stichin' Post employee **Paige Vitek**. The quilt's design is based on the artwork of this year's Quilt Show poster by local artist **Dan Rickards**.

The raffle quilt is 84" x 84" and would be the perfect size for a Queen bed quilt topper or hanging as a showpiece. There is also a pattern for the annual raffle quilt and a kit will be available from the **Stitchin' Post**.

The **38th Annual Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show** will be on **Saturday, July 13th, 2013 from 9 am - 4 pm** (Always on the second Saturday in July!) Over 1300 quilts from around the world will cover our 1880's-style town in rich texture and color.

Tickets will be for sale for \$1.00 per ticket, or you can buy 6 tickets for a reduced price of \$5.00 (one ticket free!). The winning ticket will be drawn at 4 pm on the lawn behind the Stichin' Post. Winner need not be present. Entrance to the Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show itself is free.


